

Research on the Artistic Value and Digital Protection Strategies of Xiangtangshan Grottoes

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ABSTRACT

The statues, calligraphic sutra carvings, and decorative patterns in Xiangtangshan Grottoes possess diverse artistic values. Digital protection of Xiangtangshan Grottoes not only enables the permanent preservation and complete inheritance of artistic information, but also promotes the mass communication and international expression of grotto culture. In practice, strategies such as constructing a high-precision and multi-dimensional data collection system, establishing an integrated and standardized digital resource platform, developing immersive and experiential digital display applications, and improving a long-term and collaborative protection and operation mechanism can be implemented to effectively promote the digital protection of Xiangtangshan Grottoes and facilitate their high-quality development in the new era and new stage.

1 Introduction

Article 17 of the "Law of the People's Republic of China on Cultural Relics Protection" clearly stipulates: "The state strengthens the informatization of cultural relics protection, advances digital preservation of cultural relics, and promotes the digital collection, display and utilization of cultural relics resources", which provides an institutional basis for the technological transformation and pathway upgrading of cultural relics protection. As important remains of Buddhist grotto art from the late Northern Dynasties in Handan, Hebei Province, Xiangtangshan Grottoes have been constructed over multiple dynasties and house a large number of statues, inscribed scriptures, and architectural decorations. They are highly representative among the grottoes of the same period and have exceptional artistic, historical, and academic values. Affected by multiple factors such as natural weathering, fluctuations in ambient temperature and humidity, and human disturbances, the diseases of the grottoes themselves have been continuously worsening, and the artistic information and historical relics are facing the dual crises of loss and damage. In this current context, the systematic digital protection of Xiangtangshan Grottoes is not only a concrete implementation of national cultural relics protection laws and regulations, but also an essential path to break through the limitations of traditional protection methods, maintain the authenticity and integrity of the heritage, and promote the long-term preservation and activated utilization of precious grotto art.

2 Artistic Values of Xiangtangshan Grottoes

2.1 Style Transformation and Aesthetic Breakthrough of Statue Art

The statue art of Xiangtangshan Grottoes occupies a crucial transitional phase in Chinese grotto art, which evolves from the slender and elegant figures of the Northern Wei Dynasty to the plump and robust style of the Tang Dynasty, and achieves an artistic breakthrough of great historical significance marked by distinct style transformation and mature aesthetic expression. It carries the aesthetic convention of the Northern Wei, characterized by slender and elegant figures as well as elaborate and flowing drapery. In the Eastern Wei and Northern Qi periods, it gradually evolves new characteristics such as round faces, sturdy physiques, and solemn countenances. The lines become softer and more concise, with increased focus on portraying the inner spiritual essence of the figures, thus achieving the integration of form and spirit^[1]. It boasts a comprehensive sculptural system in which Buddhas, bodhisattvas, mallas and other figures each possess their own unique demeanor. It adheres to the sacred and solemn aesthetic of Buddhist art while incorporating secular aesthetic sensibilities, and transcends the rigid conventions of earlier periods. The grottoes comprehensively employ techniques such as round carving, relief carving, and openwork carving to precisely render the physical structure, texture of garments, and facial expressions, and movements of figures. The spatial layout emphasizes balance and order, and the visual effect is calm and harmonious. The grottoes provide direct artistic experience and form references for the maturity and prosperity of Tang Dynasty statue art, and is a highly representative physical relics of the stylistic transformation of Chinese grotto art.

2.2 Artistic Excellence and Documentary Value of Calligraphic Sutra Carvings

As a typical relic of large-scale stone sutras in early Chinese grottoes, the cliff inscriptions of sutras in Xiangtangshan Grottoes bears dual values of calligraphy art and religious documents. The script integrates the brushstrokes of regular script, clerical script and seal script, forming a stable and unique system in terms of strokes, character structures and line forms. They not only possesses a stable composition and balanced structure, but also naturally accommodates both squared and rounded brushstrokes. With solid and restrained strokes as well as an elegant aura, the inscriptions epitomize the mature form of calligraphic art in the late Northern Dynasties. The carving craftsmanship of the stone sutras is meticulous and precise, faithfully reproducing the original brush essence of the calligraphy, and integrating harmoniously with the texture of the stone. It forms a simple, ancient, dignified and orderly visual style, making it an important representative of the stele calligraphy system of the Northern Dynasties. Studies in the history of calligraphy generally affirm the artistic achievement of the cliff inscriptions of sutras in Xiangtangshan Grottoes, and believe that their brushstroke characteristics, structural patterns and overall artistic rhythm lay important groundwork and accumulate vital experience for the development of calligraphy in the Tang Dynasty. These inscriptions also preserve complete versions of Buddhist scriptures, and retain the religious doctrines, cultural information and social beliefs of the Northern Dynasties with a durable form of stone carving. They provide direct and reliable physical evidence for academic research into the spread of Buddhism, the transmission and circulation of scriptures, and the social belief ecology of the Northern Dynasties, possessing irreplaceable value in both artistic aesthetics and academic research.

2.3 Integrated Innovation and Cultural Connotation of Decorative Patterns

The decorative patterns of Xiangtangshan Grottoes have formed a unique integration path under the background of multicultural interaction. Based on the foreign Buddhist art, they actively connect with the traditional aesthetic system of the Central Plains, and complete the transformation from formal imitation to indigenous reconstruction. Their cultural connotations and spirit of the times are fully embodied through this decorative pattern system. The decorative patterns used in the grottoes cover Buddhist motifs, plant patterns, geometric patterns and human figures. Motifs such as lotus, honeysuckle, flying devas, and dragons not only inherit the basic symbolic features of Indian Buddhist art, but also undergo systematic adjustments in forms, structures and lines. The lotus has evolved from single-layer petals to multiple petals with rich layers, and its lines become rounder and smoother. While maintaining its original decorative function, the honeysuckle pattern has strengthened its extensiveness and rhythmic sense, making it a representative visual symbol in the decorative system of the Northern Dynasties grottoes^[2]. Plant and geometric patterns emphasize symmetrical order and rhythm variation, with regular composition and concise lines. They not only enhance the spatial atmosphere of the caves, but also embody the spiritual sustenance and value pursuit of the ancients. These patterns integrate elements of Indian Buddhist culture, traditional Central Plains culture and Western Regions culture organically, eliminating the boundaries among cultures and directly presenting the dynamic and inclusive nature of cultural exchanges during the Northern Dynasties. They demonstrate the mature decorative craftsmanship and creation abilities of Northern Dynasties craftsmen, and carry the social aesthetic tendencies and cultural psychological structure of a specific historical period, providing an indispensable physical basis for academic research on cultural integration in the Northern Dynasties.

3 The Necessity of Digital Protection for Xiangtangshan Grottoes

3.1 Realize the Permanent Retention and Intact Transmission of Artistic Data

Carrying out digital protection for Xiangtangshan Grottoes is an important way to achieve the permanent retention and intact transmission of their artistic information. By leveraging digital technology, comprehensive and high-precision information collection and documentation can be conducted on the architectural forms, statue shapes, sutra inscriptions, and decorative patterns of the grottoes. This approach breaks through the limitations of traditional convention methods in terms of preservation dimensions, precision, and time span, and converts the non-renewable and vulnerable physical grotto art into storable and long-lasting digital resources. Digital collection methods can precisely capture the subtle textures of statues, the original brushstrokes of sutra inscriptions, and the intricate details of decorative patterns, and restore the original state and craftsmanship characteristics of the grotto art to the greatest extent, so as to effectively slow down or even prevent the attenuation and loss of artistic information caused by natural erosion and human disturbance. The establishment of a systematic and comprehensive digital archive can achieve the lossless retention and intergenerational transmission of artistic information, and provide an authentic, reliable, comprehensive, and systematic basis for subsequent academic research, public appreciation, and cultural relic restoration. In this way, the historical value and artistic essence carried by Xiangtangshan Grottoes can be continuously preserved in the digital space, and the precious heritage of outstanding Chinese traditional culture can be effectively safeguarded.

3.2 Facilitate the Universal Sharing and International Presentation of Cultural Heritage

The digital protection for Xiangtangshan Grottoes is also an important measure to promote their cultural dissemination and achieve universal sharing and international presentation. 4 Digital Preservation Strategies for Xiangtangshan Grottoes

4.1 Construction of a High-Precision and Multi-Dimensional Data Collection System

To advance the comprehensive digital information collection of Xiangtangshan Grottoes, it is necessary to standardize the collection process with rigorous and professional technical guidelines, covering all types of artistic media such as architectural caves, statues, sutra inscriptions, murals and decorations. Meanwhile, diverse technologies such as 3D laser scanning, close-range photogrammetry and ultra-high-definition video recording should be integrated to accurately capture the spatial structures, surface textures and color gradations of the grottoes, to ensure that the collected data is highly accurate, complete and authentic. Secondly, online digital exhibitions and mobile immersive experience carriers should be established by leveraging VR, AR and other technologies to enhance the sense of presence and interactivity of the viewing process. Moreover, the development of digital content should uphold the unity of

academic rigor and public readability to provide detailed data support for professional research while creating convenient and perceptible cultural contact channels for the general audience, thereby promoting the integration of Xiangtangshan Grotto art into contemporary cultural life in a modern and immersive form.

4.4 Improve a Long-term and Collaborative Protection and Operation Mechanism

To improve the long-term and collaborative operation mechanism for the digital protection of Xiangtangshan Grottoes, it is necessary to take the government as the leading entity, professional institutions as the implementation entities, and social forces as important supports, and clarify the scope of rights, responsibilities and collaboration procedures for all parties, so as to ensure the steady and sustainable development of digital protection work^[5]. Meanwhile, in light of the long-term needs of grotto protection, overall plans and phased implementation schemes should be formulated to coordinate and advance key links such as high-precision data collection, management platform construction, public presentation and dissemination, and technological iteration and update, thus achieving systematic management throughout the process. Simultaneously, the management and standardized application of intellectual property rights over digital resources should be strengthened, and the research outcomes should be efficiently implemented in academic research, public education, cultural dissemination and other scenarios.
